

The author was unknown to me so I looked her up: Born September 28, 1856 and died August 24, 1923. And she established a training school for kindergarten teachers. 

## **May Mission of the Month HOPE Missions**

Many of you already know Abraham Bezabeh from his visits to the church and the wonderful Ethiopian dinners he has cooked for us for several years. Abraham is a founding member of HOPE Missions.

The vision at HOPE Missions is simple: provide hope and improve lives through clean water, education, and building healthy communities. They do this first and

foremost by installing bio-sand water filters in remote



villages in Ethiopia. These filters not only save lives by providing families and communities with clean drinking water but they build trust and relationships with the communities that are served. These relationships then It starts with water allow the communities to share their hopes and dreams, and begin the process of working together to make those hopes a reality. For many it's giving their children the ability to hope and move towards a brighter future. This is done by starting schools, and creating the first educated generation in a village.

HOPE Missions understands their role in the work being done, not to be saviors or give hand-outs, but to build partnerships that lead to sustainable changes in the people and villages they work with. It's not about how they can improve a community but about how they can help and empower people to improve their own communities. This is why the water filters are built using simple techniques and resources local villagers can learn and have access to. It's why the Kondala School was primarily built by the parents of the students it would serve, and why construction did not begin until there was a 5-year self-sustainability plan in place. And it is this philosophy that allows them to constantly grow and reach new people and villages who are just as much in need of




