POLLY'S PONDERING

In Liberty Missouri seventh grade was at the middle school. I was in that awkward stage. I was short, somewhere under 4ft. 11inches. But my hair was long, below the waist, and my legs were longer. Christianity was new to me. I had given my life to Christ in sixth grade and was active in Sunday school and Youth Programing, yet still, I was a newbie to the faith.

My Dad traveled a lot! Heading out on the airplane almost every week. Sometimes he would bring us peanuts from the plane. Little did I know they were given away free to passengers. Following one particular trip my Dad brought me a Bible. It had a special cover denoting its previous owner as the airline he flew. It was *a Good News for Modern Man* Translation.

I wonder now as I look back over that gift, if he knew I was growing in my faith and the Bible would be a great help, or if giving me the Bible is what lead to my growing in faith. During Sunday's service, we heard three testimonies by individuals whose lives were transformed by a Gideon's Bible. And in listening to those powerful testimonies, I was reminded once more of the power of the printed Word of God. Today I have so many Bibles I have lost count. Some were required for seminary course work, some are written in Hebrew and/or Greek, and some are specialty Bibles, in picture, cartoons, or audio versions. Some I use for sermon prep. Some I hold on to because they have been passed down through the generations. None of them are the Bible my Dad gave me, sadly that has been lost in the numerous moves we have made. But what has stayed with me are the stories, and the verses that I have come to know through the reading the Bible. Two verses I love for their power to both console and comfort are "Jesus Wept." John 11:35 and "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!" Mark 9:24

Today these words from 2 Timothy 3:14-17 are in my thoughts: "But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from which you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." I am convinced that to continue growing in faith I must embark on a fresh reading of this book that transforms lives, families, and communities. And I am inviting each of you to grow in faith alongside me.

Starting this Sunday, I will be distributing a schedule that will enable us to read through the New Testament, the Psalms, and the Proverbs in one year. This is timed so next year when we celebrate Bible Sunday in August of 2022, we will be able to declare together that we have gotten into the Word and have read the New Testament, Psalms and Proverbs from start to finish. This will be done on an honor system. Each person that completes the task will be given a special recognition of the accomplishment. But the more important gift will be the increased faith, the power of the Word of God being put into hearts, and the equipping of our hearts for the days ahead.

As we plan to tell the Good News of God's love, please be in prayer for:



A.S.K.

(After School Knowledge)

We are seeking loving church and community volunteers to join this program. Of course, those with teaching experience are awesome, but no such experience is required to listen to a child read and encourage them to succeed. Each volunteer will be assigned one student to love, encourage, and tutor throughout the entire year. Our hope is that by building a special relationship with this one child, becoming their "cheerleader" and personal tutor one day a week, we can (through God's help) make a real difference in the life of each child. The number of children invited to participate in this program will be limited to the number of committed volunteers from throughout the community. So please prayerfully consider joining A.S.K.

A.S.K. will be a year-long, after-school enrichment program for First and Second grade students. Students will be recommended by the principal, counselor, and teachers for participation. The program will involve individual help with emphasis on reading and math and encouragement to succeed. Our goal is to assist children who need a little extra help to achieve at their best. Beginning the first Tuesday in October, the group will meet every Tuesday through April (except on school holidays), from 3:15pm until 5:00pm. Transportation from the elementary school to the Methodist Church will be provided. Parents will pick up their child/children at 5:00pm outside the activity building on the Methodist Church campus.

The afternoon schedule will consist of transportation from the school to the church followed by a light snack, short devotional, study period with personal tutor/mentor, and finally play time. All students are to be picked up at the church at 5:00pm. (The devotional message will center on the importance of following The Golden Rule.)


